Dear shippers, Dear business persons, Dear transport service users,

he Cameroon National Shippers' Council (CNSC) is pleased to put at your disposal the 67th issue of the "CNSC Book of Statistics".

This quarterly publication contains information sourced from the Electronic Cargo Tracking Note (ECTN) covering goods from or bound for the ports of Douala and Kribi.

In the third quarter of 2024, overall maritime traffic, except crude oil,



registered a 5.32% year-on-year increase. With an FOB value of 1,307 billion CFAF, the volume of traffic stood at 3,158 million tonnes against 2,942 million tonnes with an FOB value of 1,241 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023.

Outbound traffic over the study period was up by 40% year-on-year. Statistics reveal that 487 million tonnes of goods were loaded in the third quarter of 2024 for a total of 277 billion CFAF, against 438 million tonnes for a total of 198 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023.

On the other hand, inbound traffic recorded a 1.25% year-on-year decrease with a value of 1,029 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024. Volume-wise, trade through these ports went from 2,504 million tonnes in the third quarter of 2023 to 2,670 million tonnes in the third quarter of 2024.

The main ports that shipped goods to and received shipments from the Douala and Kribi Ports in the **third quarter of 2024** were:

- **Export:** Zhangjiagang, Haiphong, Chittagong, Hamburg, Rouen, Antwerp, Valencia, Livorno, Dakar, Nansha, New York;
- <u>Import</u>: Lome, Antwerp, Rouen, Le Havre, Qingdao, Nansha, Hamburg, Ningbo, Nhava Sheva, Jebel Ali, Rotterdam and Shanghai.

This issue of the "CNSC Book of Statistics," contains statistics of the **3**rd **quarter of 2024**. It is subdivided into two parts.

The first part (**Part A**) contains analysis of the evolution of traffic handled at the Douala and Kribi sea ports. This data is presented in terms of overall traffic, inbound traffic (imports) and outbound traffic (exports). It also relates to the evolution of trade with Cameroon's main trading partners. This refers to the countries of loading and discharge of goods. To conclude, it equally focuses on the evolution of trade in main products.

In the second part (**Part B**), statistics on trade flows (tonnage and FOB value) by country, by port and by product are presented in detail. Data on the average freight rate for imported containers (20-foot and 40-foot refrigerated or dry containers) are presented at the end of this document.

The data used for the different analysis was sourced from the Electronic Cargo Tracking Note (**ECTN**) and based on the date the ECTN request was validated.

The unit used is the *tonne* for weights and the *CFA Franc* for FOB value and freight rates.

1. Evolution of trade at the Douala and Kribi Ports 1.1. Overall traffic

In the third quarter of 2024, a total of 3,158 million tonnes of goods (*excluding crude oil*) loaded or discharged at the ports of Douala and Kribi were covered by an ECTN. This corresponds to a total value of 1,307 billion CFAF compared to 1,241 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024, and represents a year-on-year value increase of 5.32%.

Traffic at the port of Douala accounted for 82% of the overall value of traffic in the 3rd quarter of 2024, and fell by 1% year-on-year value-wise. In contrast, traffic at the port of Kribi increased year-on-year by 53% in value and 8% in volume, during the period under review.

1.2. Outbound traffic

During the period under review, 487 thousand tonnes of goods destined for export were recorded for a value of 277 billion CFAF, corresponding to an increase in value of 40% year-on-





year. This increase in the value of traffic is the result of a cumulative year-on-year increase in traffic at the ports of Douala and Kribi of 27% and 120% respectively.

1.3. Inbound traffic

The volume of goods landed at the ports of Douala and Kribi in the third quarter of 2024 was 2,670 thousand tonnes, with a corresponding value of 1,029 billion CFAF, compared with 2,504 thousand tonnes for a total value of 1,042 billion CFAF over the same period in 2023. This represents a 1.25% year-on-year drop in value. This drop in traffic value is explained by the 7% year-on-year drop in traffic value at the port of Douala.

2. Main partners 2.1. Export partners

During the period under review, 81% of the total value of goods loaded at the ports of Douala and Kribi was destined for eleven countries, led by **Bangladesh** (17%), followed by the **Netherlands** (13%), **France** (10%) and **Belgium** (9%).

Following an increase in the value of **Cotton** exports from 25 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023 to 45.7 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024, traffic to **Bangladesh** witnessed an 86% year-on-year increase.

In the third quarter of 2024, the value of outbound traffic destined for the **Netherlands** rose by 7% year-on-year and mainly comprised of the following products:

- Cocoa paste: 18.6 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 4.7 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- Cocoa beans: 10.5 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 18.6 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- Cocoa butter, fats and oil: 3.9 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 1.4 billion CFAF in the fourth third of 2023;
- ✓ Sawn wood: 1.2 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 1.5 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;

Exports to **France** recorded a 78% year-on-year increase in the third quarter of 2024 and were dominated by the following products:

- ✓ Cocoa butter, fats and oil: 16.2 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 1.9 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- ✓ Cocoa paste: 5.3 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 2.5 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- ✓ Banana: 2.1 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 0.04 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- ✓ Sawn wood: 1.4 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 2.5 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;

Traffic to **Belgium** witnessed a 25% year-on-year increase in value for the third quarter of 2024 thanks to exports which mainly comprised of:

- ✓ Sawn wood: 14 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 15 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- ✓ Banana: 7.4 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 1.8 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- *Rubber:* 2.1 *billion CFAF* in the third quarter of 2024 against 1 *billion CFAF* in the third quarter of 2023;

Traffic to the **USA** witnessed a 311% year-on-year increase in the 3rd quarter of 2024, with exports comprised of the following products:

- Cocoa paste: 13.7 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 0.7 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- ✓ Sawn wood: 1.1 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 1.6 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- *Rubber*: 1.1 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 1.2 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;

In the third quarter of 2024, the value of outbound traffic destined for **Italy** rose by 35% year-on-year and mainly comprised of the following products:

- ✓ Sawn wood: 4.8 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 4.2 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- ✓ Plywood: 3.07 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 3.6 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- ✓ Coffee: 2.4 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 0.6 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;

Traffic to **Spain** witnessed a 51% year-on-year increase in value for the 3rd quarter of 2024 thanks to exports which mainly comprised of:

✓ Cocoa beans: 5 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 1.1 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;

2.2. Import partners

✓ Sawn wood: 3.4 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 4.3 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;

✓ Cocoa paste: 2.6 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 1.3 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;

The value of exports destined to **China** recorded a 32% year-on-year increase in the third quarter of 2024 and mainly comprised of the following products:

- ✓ Sawn wood: 5.1 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 4.4 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- ✓ Wood logs: 3.5 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 8.5 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- Cotton: 1.8 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 3.1 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;

Following an increase in the value of *Cocoa paste* exports (CFAF 3.8 bn in Q3 2024 against CFAF 1.1 bn in Q3 2023), *Cocoa butter, fats and oils* (CFAF 3,663 bn in Q3 2024 against CFAF 3, 667 bn in Q3 2024), *Rubber* (CFAF 1.6 bn in Q3 2024 compared with CFAF 0.7 bn in Q3 2024), traffic to **Germany** rose by 55% year-on-year in Q3 2024.

Similarly, an increase in the value of *Sawn wood* exports which went from CFAF 3.5 billion in Q3 2023 to CFAF 4.2 billion in Q3 2024, caused traffic to **North Vietnam** to rise by 5% year-on-year in Q3 2024.

In the third quarter of 2024, 74% of the total value of goods that landed at the Ports of Douala and Kribi came from thirteen countries, amongst which **China** with a share of 18%, followed by **Belgium** (11%), **Togo** (9%), **Singapore** (8%) and **France** (7%).

Imports from China recorded a 19% year-on-year increase in the third quarter of 2024 and mainly comprised:

- Cast iron, iron or steel: 15.8 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 13.2 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- Plastics and articles thereof 12.5 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 4.9 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- *Rice:* 9.2 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 0 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- ✓ Vehicles: 9.7 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 14.5 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- ✓ Insecticides/fungicides/herbicides: 8.5 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 5.7 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;

Imports from **Belgium** recorded a 3% year-onyear decline in the third quarter of 2024 and mainly comprised the following products:

- ✓ <u>Mineral fuels and mineral oils</u>: 45.5 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 35 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- ✓ Vehicles: 16.8 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 22.5 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- ✓ Petroleum materials and equipment: 3.4 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 5.8 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;

Imports from **Togo** decreased by 62% year-onyear in Q3 2024, following a drop in the value of imports of *Mineral Fuels and Mineral Oils* from this country which went from 247.4 billion CFAF in Q3 2023 to 94.5 billion CFAF in Q3 2024.

Thanks to the entry of *lightships, pumpboats, dredgers, crane pontoons and other vessels* (84.26 billion CFAF in Q3 2024 compared with 0 CFAF in Q3 2023), year-on-year traffic from Singapore increased eightfold in value in Q3 2024.

In the third quarter of 2024, imports from **France** were down by 12% year-on-year. The main products imported were:

- Pharmaceutical products: 25.5 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 21.8 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- Malt: 5.1 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 9.2 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- ✓ Wheat: 4.8 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 14.9 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;

The year-on-year value of traffic from Thailand increased sevenfold in Q3 2024, following a strong inflow of *Rice* imports (46.5 bn CFAF in Q3 2024 compared with 5.6 bn CFAF in Q3 2023).

Imports from **India** recorded a 41% year-on-year decline in the third quarter of 2024 and mainly comprised the following products:



- Pharmaceutical products: 3.3 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 5.1 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- ✓ Books, brochures and similar printed materials: 2.9 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 1.4 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- ✓ Vehicles: 2.8 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 2.3 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- ✓ Frozen fish: 2.03 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 1.1 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;

Imports from **Turkey** recorded a 74% year-onyear increase in the third quarter of 2024 and mainly comprised of the following products:

- ✓ Dried leguminous vegetables, whether or not shelled or broken 2.04 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 0.2 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- ✓ Wires, cables and other conductors insulated for electricity 2.01 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 0.158 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;

3. Main products transported 3.1. Export products

- ✓ Electrical transformers, static converters: 1.9 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 0.013 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;
- ✓ Cigars, cigarillos and cigarettes: 1.8 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2024 against 1.7 billion CFAF in the third quarter of 2023;

Owing to a fall in the value of *Sugar* imports (21.2 billion CFAF in Q3 2024 compared with 28.3 billion CFAF in Q3 2023), year-on-year traffic from **Brazil** fell by 32% in Q3 2024.

Imports from **Nigeria** increased by 409% year-onyear in Q3 2024, thanks to a high influx of *Mineral fuels and oils* (13.4 billion CFAF in Q3 2024 compared with 0 billion CFAF in Q3 2023) and *Clinkers* (4.09 billion CFAF in Q3 2024 compared with 0.863 billion CFAF in Q3 2023).

Following an increase in the value of imports of *Dishwashers; machines and appliances for cleaning or drying bottles or other containers; machines and appliances for filling, closing, capping or labelling* (3.8 bn CFAF in Q3 2024 compared with 0.983 bn CFAF in Q3 2023), traffic from **Germany** rose by 6% year-on-year in Q3 2024.

Exports via the Ports of Douala and Kribi in the third quarter of 2024 were dominated by eleven key products, accounting for 96% of the overall value of exports.

This traffic was dominated by *Sawn wood*, representing 18% of the overall value of goods shipped, followed by *Cotton* (18%) and *Cocoa paste* (16%). We also observe a considerable year-on-year increase in **Cocoa butter** and **Cocoa paste** exports, reaching 225% and 284%, respectively.

3.2. Import products

Mineral fuels and mineral oils constituted the main products shipped in the third quarter of the year 2024 with a volume of 411 thousand tonnes for an estimated 159 billion CFAF and accounting for 18.5% of the total value of imports for the period. These were closely followed by lightships, pumpboats, dredgers, crane pontoons and other vessels (8.1%), Rice (5.7%), Wheat (4.9%) and Cars and spare parts thereof (4.2%)
