An outstanding achievement in the movement of goods across Africa through customs dismantling, this operation also constitutes a major milestone in the mission entrusted to the CNSC whose General Manager chairs the Ad-hoc Sub-committee tasked with facilitating the implementation of AfCFTA's Guided Trade Initiative. This brings to mind the instructions of the President of the Republic of Cameroon, H.E. Paul Biya, during his traditional end-of-year address to the nation on Saturday 31 December 2022 during which he declared that "the Government will continue to accord special attention to the coordinated implementation of the Import-Substitution policy, and make optimal use of the opportunities offered by the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA)".

As part of its mission to promote Cameroon's foreign trade and to support local businesses, the Cameroon National Shippers' Council was a key participant in major trade events organised in the month of July, such as the 12th edition of the Trade Fair for Government Action (SAGO) and the 14th edition of the Central Africa Annual Cross-Border Fair (FOTRAC).

In conclusion, this edition of the Shippers' Newsletter also reports on the meeting held between the CNSC and the High Business Council of the Economic Community of Central African States (**HBC-ECCAS**) in Douala, and on the various appointments made during the 41st Board Meeting of the Cameroon National Shippers' Council (**CNSC**).

Tunisian resins in Cameroon


