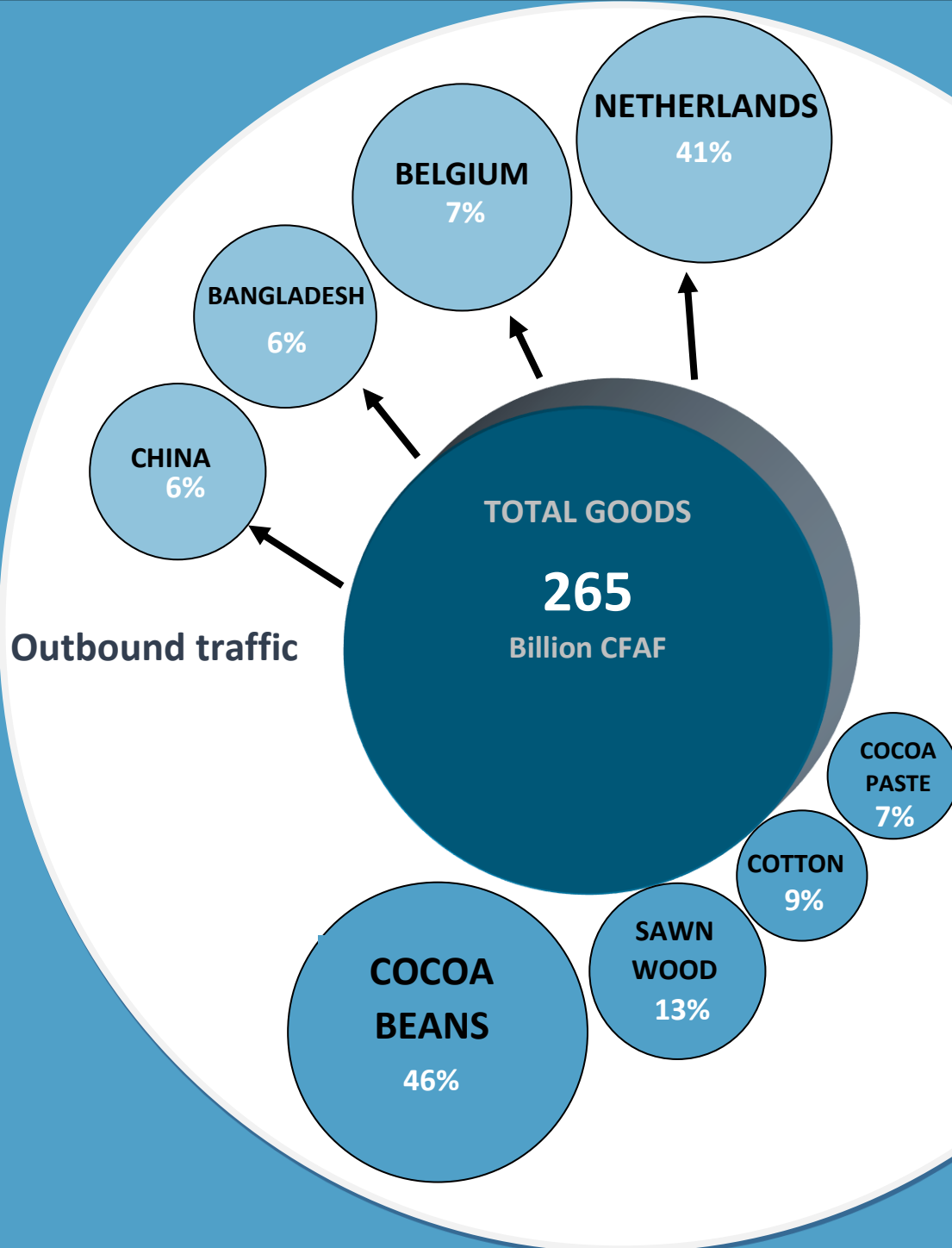

The Cameroon National Shippers' Council is pleased to put at your disposal the 57<sup>th</sup> issue of the "CNSC Book of Statistics".

This quarterly publication contains information sourced from the Electronic Cargo Tracking Note (ECTN) covering goods from or bound for the ports of Douala and Kribi.

In the first quarter of 2022, overall maritime traffic, except crude oil, registered a 34% year-on-year increase.

With an FOB value of 1,175 billion CFAF, the volume of traffic over this period stood at 2,977,693 tonnes against 2,569,799 tonnes with an FOB value of 875 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021.

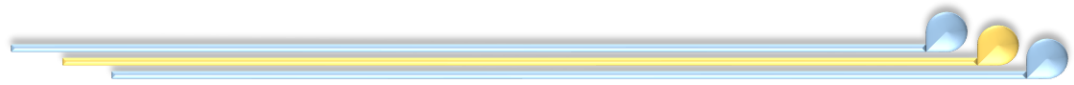
Outbound traffic was down by 3% year-on-year and statistics show that 488,818 tonnes of goods were loaded in the first quarter of 2022 for a total of 265 billion CFAF, against 553,868 tonnes for a total of 273 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021.

Inbound traffic in turn recorded a 51% year-on-year increase with a value of 910 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022. Volume wise, imports to Cameroon recorded a marked increase from 2,015,931 tonnes in the first quarter of 2021 to 2,488,875 tonnes in the first quarter of 2022.

The main ports that shipped goods to and received shipments from the Douala and Kribi Ports in the first quarter of 2022 were **Zhangjiagang, Amsterdam, Antwerp, Haiphong, Lomé, Port-Saïd, Koh Sichang, Oran, Kakinada, San Lorenzo, Annaba and Novorossiysk.**

This issue of the “CNSC Book of Statistics,” contains statistics of the **1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2022**. It is subdivided into two parts.

The first part (Part A) contains analysis of the evolution of traffic handled at the Douala and Kribi sea ports. This analysis concerns goods covered by ECTNs (***overall trade or overall traffic***), goods covered by import ECTNs (***inbound trade or inbound traffic***) and goods covered by export ECTNs (***export trade or export traffic***). It also relates to the evolution of trade with Cameroon's main trading partners. This refers to the countries of loading and discharge of goods. Finally, it equally focuses on the evolution of trade in main products.

In the second part (Part B), statistics on trade flows (tonnage and FOB value) by country, by port and by product are presented in detail. Data on the average freight rate for imported Twenty-tonne Equivalent Units (TEUs), whether refrigerated or dry, are presented at the end of this document.

The unit used is the **tonne** for weights and the **CFA Franc** for **FOB value** and **freight rates**.

## 1. Evolution of trade at the Douala and Kribi Ports

### 1.1. Overall traffic

In the first quarter of 2022, a total of 2,977,693 tonnes of goods (*excluding crude oil*) loaded or discharged at the ports of Douala and Kribi were covered by an ECTN. This corresponds to a total value of 1,175<sup>1</sup> billion CFAF compared to 875 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021, and represents a year-on-year value increase of 34%.

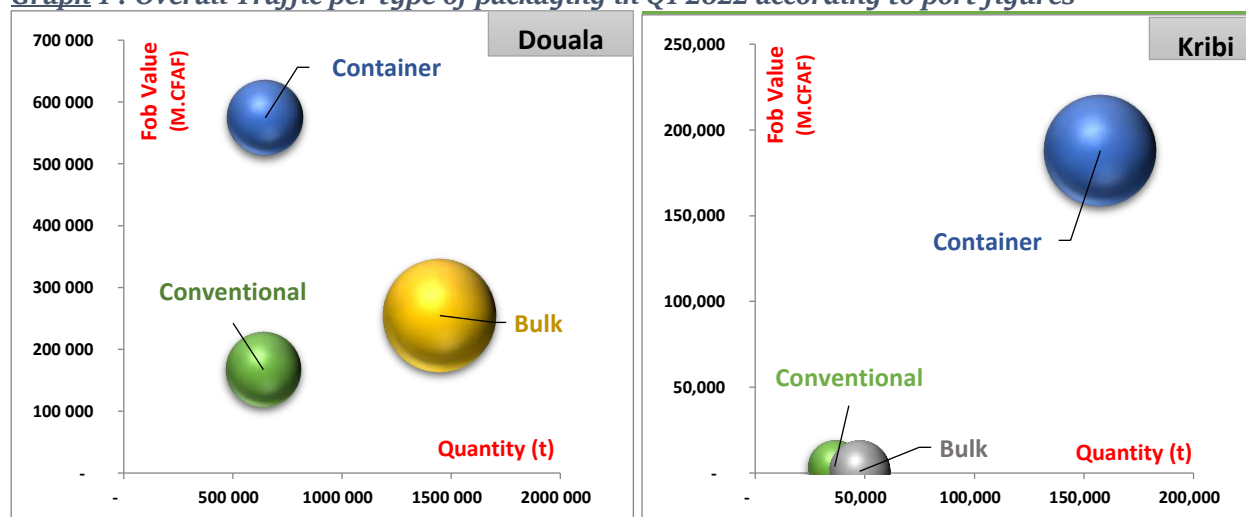

In the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2022, traffic at the Douala Port accounted for 85% of the overall traffic and was dominated by containerised goods, which represented 58% of the total traffic in this port all worth 574 billion CFAF. Moreover, during the period under study, the Port of Kribi recorded the entry of bulk packaging for a volume of 47,640 tonnes worth 1 billion CFAF and an overall increase in traffic for which the volume of goods having passed through the port stood at 241,431 tonnes and accounted for a year-on-year growth of 38%.

## 1.2. Outbound traffic

In the first quarter of 2022, some 488,818 tonnes of goods destined for export were recorded for a value of 265 billion CFAF, making for a year-on-year value increase of 3%.

## 1.3. Inbound traffic

From January to March of 2022, the volume of goods offloaded at the ports of Douala and Kribi stood at 2,488,875 tonnes worth 910 billion CFAF, making for a 51% year-on-year value increase. Noteworthy is the 65% increase in the volume of traffic at the Port of Kribi compared to the first quarter of the year 2021.

## 2. Main partners

### 2.1. Export partners

In the first quarter of 2022, 85% of the overall value of goods loaded at the ports of Douala and Kribi were destined for eleven countries, with the Netherlands in the lead, accounting for 41% of the overall value of goods exported. Belgium and Bangladesh ranked second and third with 7% and 6%, respectively.

In the first quarter of 2022, the value of outbound traffic destined for the **Netherlands** rose by 3% year-on-year and mainly comprised of the following products:

- ✓ **Cocoa beans:** 97 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 101 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Cocoa paste:** 3 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 1 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Sawn wood:** 2 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 1 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021.

Traffic to **Belgium** witnessed a 20% year-on-year increase in value for the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of

2022 thanks to exports which mainly comprised of:

- ✓ **Sawn wood:** 9 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 4 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Banana:** 3 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 4 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Cocoa beans:** 3 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 2 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021.

Owing to a drop in the value of Cotton exports from 22 billion CFAF in Q1 2021 to 16 billion CFAF in Q1 2022, traffic to **Bangladesh** witnessed a 25% drop.

Exports to **China** recorded a 4% year-on-year increase in the first quarter of 2022



and mainly comprised of the following products:

- ✓ **Wood logs:** 7 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 11 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Sawn wood:** 4 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 3 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Cotton:** 4 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 2 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021.

Traffic to **Malaysia** saw an 18% year-on-year increase in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2022 with exports comprised of the following products:

- ✓ **Cocoa beans:** 11 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 12 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Cocoa paste:** 3 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 2 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021.

Exports to **France** recorded a 27% year-on-year increase in the first quarter of 2022 and were dominated by the following products:

- ✓ **Cocoa butter, fats and oil:** 5.6 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 5.5 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Unwrought aluminium:** 3 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 1 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Sawn wood:** 2.2 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 1.6 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;

- ✓ **Cocoa paste:** 2 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 1 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021.

With a 5% year-on-year decline in value for the first quarter of 2022, exports to the **United States of America** was mainly driven by the following products:

- ✓ **Cocoa paste:** 4.9 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 4.6 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Sawn wood:** 2 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 1 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Rubber latex:** 2 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 1 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021.

Exports to **Italy** fell by 28% in the first quarter of 2022, year-on-year, following a 67% drop in the value of Aluminium exports to that country. The said value went from 6 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021 to 2 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022.

Owing to an increase in the value of cocoa bean exports from 0.3 billion CFAF in Q1 2021 to 3 billion CFAF in Q1 2022, traffic to **Spain** witnessed a 15% year-on-year increase during the period under study.

Exports to **Turkey** rose by 41% in the first quarter of 2022, year-on-year, following a 61% increase in the value of Cocoa bean exports to that country, which went from 4 billion CFA francs in the first quarter of 2021 to 7 billion CFA francs in the first quarter of 2022.

## 2.2. Import partners

In the first quarter of 2022, three quarters of the total value of goods offloaded at the ports of Douala and Kribi came from eleven countries, with France and China in first place each accounting for 14% of imports, followed by Belgium (11%) and Togo (11%).

Over the period under study, imports from **France** stood at 132 billion CFAF with an 82% year-on-year increase. The main products imported were:

- ✓ **Pharmaceutical products:** 26 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 16 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Wheat:** 8 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 18 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Malt:** 5 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 3 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021.

Imports from **China** recorded a 3% year-on-year decline in the first quarter of 2022 and mainly comprised of:

- ✓ **Cast iron, iron or steel:** 8 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 23 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;

- ✓ **Insecticides/fungicides/herbicides:** 18 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 12 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;

- ✓ **Rice:** 3 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 11 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021.

Imports from **Belgium** recorded a 38% year-on-year increase in the first quarter of 2022 and mainly comprised of the following products:

- ✓ **Vehicles:** 19 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 24 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Animal feed:** 2.1 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 2.1 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Milk and cream:** 7 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 2 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;

- ✓ **Malt** : 3 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 2 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Worn clothing**: 1.81 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 1.88 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021.

Imports from **Togo** increased by 590% year-on-year in Q1 2022, following a 681% increase in the value of imports of gas oil making up 98% of imports from this country. The value of traffic leaped from 13 billion CFAF in Q1 2021 to 100 billion CFAF in Q1 2022.

Imports from **India** recorded a year-on-year increase of 27% in the first quarter of 2022 for a value of 46 billion CFAF, and were dominated by the following products:

- ✓ **Rice**: 24 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 13 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Insecticides/fungicides/herbicides**: 1.7 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 1.2 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Frozen fish**: 0.5 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 3 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021.

With an increase in Gas oil imports from 0.2 billion CFAF in Q1 2021 to 58 billion CFAF in Q1 2022, representing 81% of overall imports from **Italy**, imports from that country went up by 196%.

Imports from **Russia** increased by 113% year-on-year and were dominated by the following products:

- ✓ **Wheat**: 12 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 7 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Fertilisers**: 6 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 4 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Cast iron, iron or steel**: : 1.7 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 0.09 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021.

Imports from **Argentina** recorded a 422% year-on-year increase in the first quarter of 2022 and mainly comprised of:

- ✓ **Wheat**: 14 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 0 CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Maize (corn)**: 6 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 2 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Soybean meal**: : 2 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 1 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021.

Imports from **Turkey** recorded a 74% year-on-year increase in the first quarter of 2022 and mainly comprised of the following products:

- ✓ **Cast iron, iron or steel**: : 1.5 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 1.3 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021;
- ✓ **Clinker** : 3 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2022 against 4 billion CFAF in the first quarter of 2021.

### 3. Main products transported

#### 3.1. Export products

Exports via the Ports of Douala and Kribi in the first quarter of 2022 were dominated by ten key products accounting for 94% of the overall value of exports.

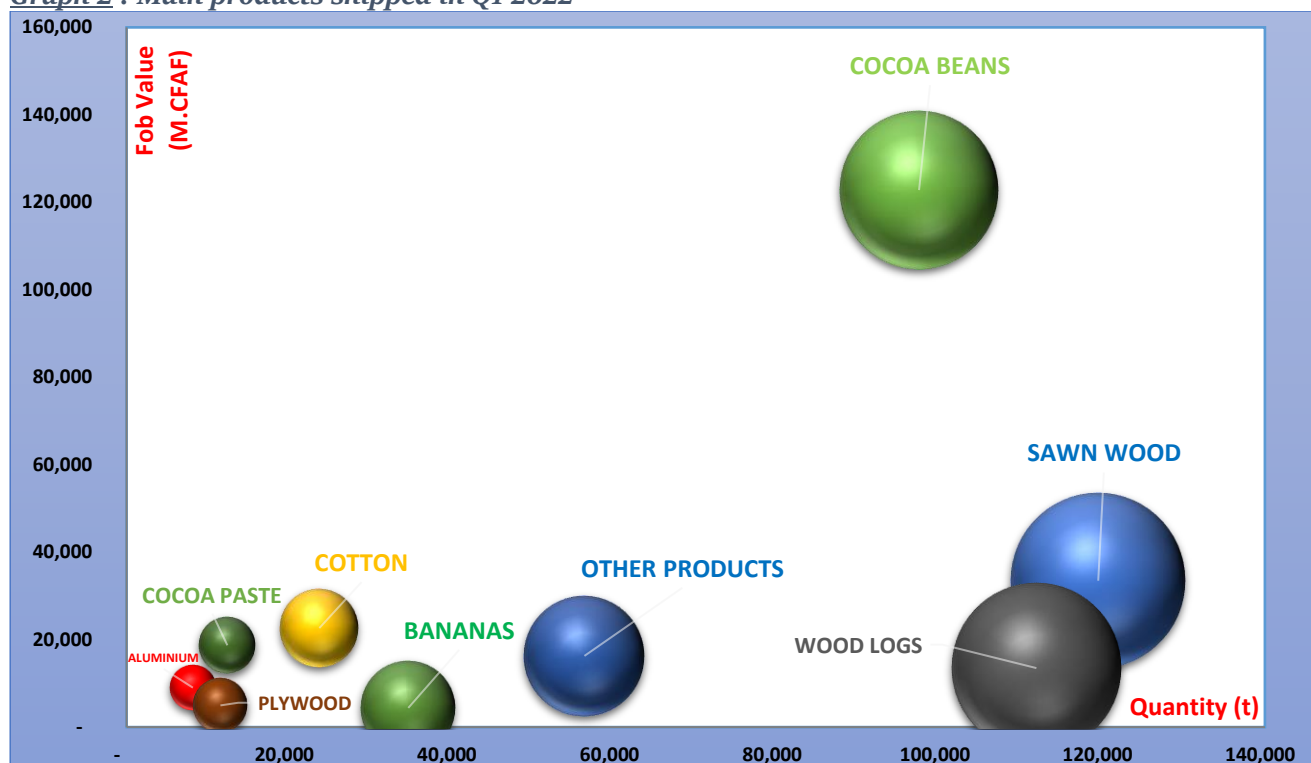

This traffic was dominated by Cocoa beans representing 46% of the overall value of goods shipped, followed by Sawn wood (13%), Cotton (9%), and Cocoa paste (7%).

### 3.2. Import products

Imported mineral fuels, representing 428,956 tonnes worth CFAF 172 billion, or 19% of the overall value, were the main product imported in the first quarter of the year 2022. This is followed by Cars and their parts (5%), rice (5%), wheat (4%), frozen fish (4%), and pharmaceutical products (4%).
